

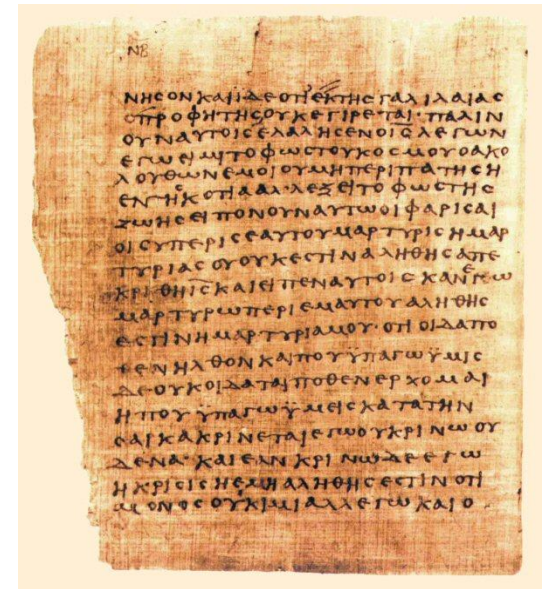
LATIN III/IV: EXAMPLES OF FIGURES OF SPEECH

REQUIREMENTS AND GRADING:

- In Latin, your figure of speech must be emphasized by underlining it.

 3. Noting the sources from which your example comes (25)
 4. You only get to ask two questions that will directly affect the answer of your grade.
 5. Examples: 10 Latin and 15 English



e.g. (*exempli gratia*):

metonymy: use of one noun in place of another closely related noun to avoid common or prosaic words.

Latin:

tum Cererem corruptam undis Cerelaliaque arma expediunt fessi rerum . . . *Aeneid* 1.177-178

English:
